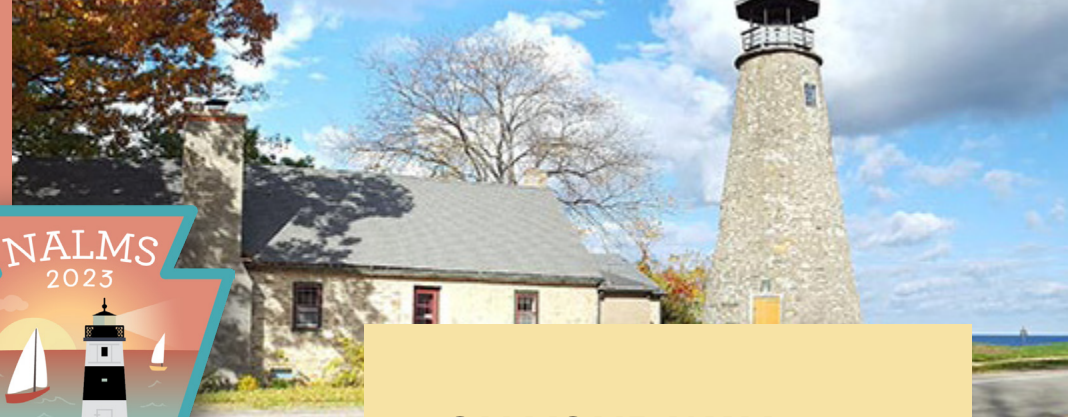
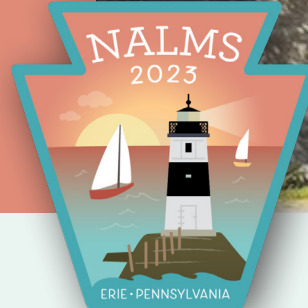


THINGS TO DO NEARBY



BUFFALO AREA

NIAGARA FALLS, NEW YORK

Niagara Falls State Park, is a 400-acre gateway to the Falls which straddle the Canadian border. In Niagara Falls State Park, the Observation Tower, at Prospect Point, juts out over Niagara Gorge for a view of all 3 waterfalls. Trails from the Niagara Gorge Discovery Center lead to other viewpoints. You're likely to catch the Falls in all their snow-white frosted majesty — and there's no better place to catch a view (and a selfie!) than the park's Prospect Point.

OLD FORT NIAGARA

The history of Old Fort Niagara spans more than 300 years. During the colonial wars in North America, a fort at the mouth of the Niagara River was vital, for it controlled access to the Great Lakes and the westward route to the heartland of the continent. With the completion of the Erie Canal in 1825, however, the strategic value of Fort Niagara diminished. It nonetheless remained an active military post well into the 20th century.

ON YOUR WAY TO ERIE

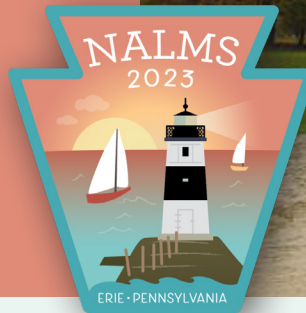
From Buffalo be sure to visit **BARCELONA HARBOR PIER**. Spring through Fall this is a very busy Lake Erie boat launch seeing over 100 boats some days. There is also a cool lighthouse and museum to visit.

Another great stop as you travel to Erie is **CHAUTAUQUA LAKE**. Formed during a glacial retreat at the end of the Ice Age, this beautiful lake is home to many aquatic plants and animals. 52 different species of underwater plants have been inventoried as being present at times in Chautauqua Lake since 1937. 81 species of fish have been catalogued in Chautauqua Lake since 1902. During the last 100 years Chautauqua Lake has become a significant recreational area.

CLEVELAND AQUARIUM

The Greater Cleveland Aquarium is an aquarium in Cleveland, Ohio. Occupying the historic FirstEnergy Powerhouse building located on the west bank of the Cuyahoga River in the city's Flats district, the aquarium, which opened in January 2012, consists of approximately 70,000 square feet of exhibition space and features 55 exhibits over 9 thematic concentrations representing both local and exotic species of fish. The facility is the only independent, free-standing aquarium in the state of Ohio and ended a 26-year period that the city lacked a public aquarium.

Take a step back in time on a century-old cable car and see the best views of downtown Pittsburgh while riding one of the few remaining inclines in the country. Opened on May 20, 1877, the Duquesne Incline was rescued & restored by a group of local residents in 1963 and still delights residents and visitors with its original, elegant, wooden cable cars.

ON YOUR WAY TO ERIE

From Pittsburgh be sure to check out **PYMATUNING STATE PARK**. This is a Pennsylvania state park covering 21,122 acres right off of I-79. Locals say there is great fishing year-round at the reservoir.

Another favorite stop along the drive is the **GROVE CITY OUTLET MALL**.

POINT STATE PARK

Point State Park, located at the confluence of three rivers, is at the tip of Pittsburgh's "Golden Triangle." The park commemorates and preserves the strategic and historic heritage of the area during the French and Indian War (1754-1763). Point State Park is a National Historic Landmark.
